SHIP SALES

As mentioned in our Report and Accounts last year, due to the severity of the depressed trading conditions in the Shipping Industry during the last few years, the Group has, of necessity, become involved in a certain amount of de-gearing; that is, a reduction in the amount of its borrowing. In accordance with this policy, the m.v. "ORIENT CITY" was sold in August 1978 and this was followed by the disposal of our interest in the Drilling Rig - "SEA CONQUEST" in February this year. On 6th July and 10th July respectively, the m.v. "VANCOUVER CITY", (our oldest vessel) and the "EASTERN CITY" (on which we had the heaviest loan) were also sold.

Naturally, the sale of these vessels is regretted, but these steps have gone a long way towards reducing the gearing of the Group and, with signs of more profitable levels of trading returning, it is not anticipated that any further sales will be necessary.

SHIPS POSITIONS

As at 23rd July, 1979

m.v. "CARDIFF CITY" Vessel sails from Oakland 24th July for Portland and New Westminster to complete discharge of cargo of Steel. On completion, vessel has been nominated to operate under Berth Service BS.106 loading New Westminster, Eureka 3/5th August, Coos Bay 6/8th, Crofton 10/11th and Vancouver BC 12/18th, for discharge Newcastle, London, Rotterdam and Brake.

m.v. "DEVON CITY" This vessel operating under Time Charter account CBC completes Antwerp about 27th July. Fixed Time Charter account Safmarine, delivery when/where ready Antwerp round voyage via South Africa, redelivery UK/Cont or U.S. Atlantic/Gulf.

m.v. "FRESNO CITY" Vessel is operating under Time Charter account Cast. She sailed from Richards Bay on 16th July with a cargo of Coal bound for Savona where her ETA/D is 4/10th August. Further business is not yet known.

m.v. "NEW WESTMINSTER CITY" Now operating under Time Charter account Hamlet Shipping Inc., New York. She was delivered at Rotterdam on 12th July and is due in Pensacola 26th July to load Bagged Flour for Egypt.

m.v. "PORT ALBERNI CITY" Vessel arrives Sorel 24th July to load a cargo of Bulk Barley for Bandar Abbas. She is expected to sail Sorel about 3rd August transitting the Suez Canal 19/20th. She then calls Jeddah for Bunkers arriving Bandar Abbas about 29th August.

m.v. "PRINCE RUPERT CITY" Vessel is operating under Berth Service BS.105. She is expected to transit the Panama Canal 23rd July following which her itinerary is London 7/11th August, Boulogne 12/13th and Rotterdam 14/17th.

m.v. "TACOMA CITY" Operating under Time Charter account Cast. She sailed from Richards Bay on 6th July and should discharge her cargo of Coal and Ore at Valencia 24/29th July and Rotterdam 2/5th August.

m.v. "VICTORIA CITY" Vessel sails from Flushing on 30th July after drydocking, and is nominated for East Coast Service EC4. Her itinerary is as follows:- ETA/D Antwerp 30/6th August, Providence R.I. 17/19th Bridgeport 20/22nd, Camden 23/25th and Baltimore 25/28th.

m.v. "WELSH CITY" Operating under Time Charter account Cetrappa. She is expected to arrive in Fos from Richards Bay on 26th July to discharge Coal and Ore. She will then sail about 31st July for Corpus Christi and load Grain for Germany.

m.v. "AMPARO" This vessel has the following itinerary:-
Acajutla ETA/D 24/24th July, Puntarenas 25/27th, Balboa/
Cristobal 28/29th, Port Lisas 1/3rd August, Puerto Cortes
7/9th arriving Vera Cruz 12th August, after which she transfers
to the Atlantic Service loading at Mexican and U.S. Gulf ports
for discharge Hamburg and Rotterdam.

m.v. "BIBI" Sailed Mazatlan 22nd July for Los Angeles 25/27th
July. She then proceeds to the following ports:- Yokohama
7/8th August, Nagoya 9th, Osaka/Kobe 10/13th, Busan 15/17th,
Keelung 19/20th and Hong Kong where her ETA is about 21st.

m.v. "JOSEFA" Sailed Tampico 21st July for Progreso 22/25th,
Coatzacoalcos 26/27th, Havre 8/10th August, Antwerp 11/13th
and Hamburg 15/16th. Thereafter drydocks for 10 days.

m.v. "MARIA ELISA" Arriving in Bilbao about 26th July and
sails 2nd August for Vera Cruz where her ETA/D is about
17/23rd August. Vessel then proceeds to Tampico 24/27th,
Coatzacoalcos 28/29th, Progreso 30/31st and Morehead City
4/10th September.

m.v. "SAMIA" Sailed Le Havre 21st July for Coatzacoalcos,
ETA 3rd August. Vessel then proceeds Vera Cruz 4/7th,
Tampico 8/10th, to discharge in Hamburg about 23/25th and
Rotterdam 27/28th.

m.v. "SARA LUPE" Sailed Tampico 22nd July for Morehead
City 26/31st July, Barcelona 12/13th August, Marseilles
14/15th, Naples 16/17th, Leghorn 18/21st, Genoa 22/24th
after which she drydocks for about 8 days in an unspecified

Of the 300 commercial and government ships participating in our marine weather program last year, 35 ocean-going and coastal ships will receive a "ship award" for group achievement of all officers. This award consists of a Certificate of Achievement and a copy of the book "The History of Ships", by Basil Lubbock. Seventeen ships operating on the Great Lakes will receive a Certificate of Achievement. Award-winning ships are selected on the basis of the quantity of weather observations made and transmitted, and also on their quality.

Thirty-five deck officers, most of whom served on award-winning ships, will receive individual awards for outstanding contributions to the program. Their awards are a copy of the book "Sail, Steam and Splendour", by Byron S. Miller, or in the case of Great Lakes officers, a copy of "Land of the Inland Seas", by William D. Ellis.

Radio Officers also contribute greatly to our marine weather program, and the fifteen officers who transmitted the most weather reports to coastal radio stations will receive a copy of the book "Atlas of Man".
